CHINA SPRING YOUTH CAMP VISITING INFORMATION

During your child's placement at the Camp, you will have an active role in your child's treatment program. As such, visitation privileges are offered in a fashion consistent with your child's behavior and progress in his/her treatment plan. In-camp family visits will be limited to parents, grandparents, and/or legal guardians only. Visiting is always Mondays for both Aurora Pines Girls Facility and China Spring Youth Camp (Times are described below).

Exceptions to the visiting guidelines are rarely granted; however, it is per Case Management discretion. Please contact your son/daughter's Case Manager for further details and approval. Your son/daughter may receive a phone call, if he/she was unable to receive an in camp visit that week. You may call Monday through Friday and set these calls up through Case Management ONLY. Due to resource demands, your son /daughter's phone call will be limited to ten minutes. As with in camp visits your son/daughter may only speak to parents, grandparents, and/or legal guardians.

VISITING RULES:

- 1. Visits are on Mondays (CSYC= 3:00pm-5:00pm & APGF= 5:00pm-7:00pm). (You must call your son/daughter's Case Manager to be placed on the list weekly).
- 2. ONLY Parents/Grandparents/Guardians are allowed to visit.
- **3.** Any visitor under the influence of an intoxicant will not be allowed on Camp property. Local law enforcement will be notified and you will be asked to leave.
- **4.** All visitors and vehicles are subject to search.
- **5.** No unauthorized visitors are allowed in Camp.
- **6.** Visitors must park in the designated parking areas.
- 7. All visitors will report to the appropriate dormitory lobby and report to a counselor/case manager for check in. (You must have a valid Driver's License or Picture ID)
- **8.** Visitors may not give anything directly to a resident. If you have something for a resident, it must be given to staff immediately upon arrival.
- **9.** Visitors may not bring food, gum, candy or beverages from outside Camp.
- 10. Visitors are not to bring cameras, cell phones or electronic devices into the visits.
- **11.** The facility is a NO SMOKING facility pursuant to N.R.S. 202.2491.
